


OVERVIEW OF TRAFFIC & ROAD SAFETY There was a **19.2**% decrease in common offences registered by the Directorate of Traffic and Road Safety countrywide from **528,025** cases registered in 2023 to **426,432** cases in 2024.




Victims/Casualties of Road Crashes

There were **25,808** casualties from road crashes in 2024 compared to **24,728** in 2023, giving a **4.4%** increase in the number of casualties.


TIME OF CRASHES

More crashes were reported to have occurred during day time than the night time. A similar trend is also reflected in fatal crashes where more fatal crashes are reported to have occurred during day time.




FATAL CRASHES BY TIME OF DAY

The highest number of crashes in 2024 (**3,780**) occurred between 18:00hrs and 19:59hrs. Similarly, fatal crashes (**894**) were also highest between 18:00hrs and 19:59hrs.




CRASHES BY DAY OF THE WEEK

There were more crashes **(3,790)** reported on Sundays than any other day of the week in 2024. In addition, 3,765 and 3,686 crashes were reported on Saturdays and Mondays. Fewer crashes (3,330) were reported on Tuesdays compared to the other days of the week.




CRASHES BY COLLISION TYPES

Collisions with pedestrians constituted 19.5% of all crashes. Rear end collisions and side swipes accounted for 16.2% and 17.7% respectively. Head on collisions accounted for 13% and angle collisions for 10.5% of all crashes. 9% of all crashes were single vehicle crashes. Collisions where vehicles hit other parked vehicles, hit objects on road, hit objects off road and hit animals accounted for 1.6%, 1.5%, 1.8% and 0.8% respectively.



CAUSES OF CRASHES

Careless Overtaking and Speeding were the leading causes of road crashes in the year 2024 accounting for close to almost half (44.5%) of all crashes.
